NEW BA IN AAAS REQUIREMENTS:

- 39 credit hours.
- 18 hours of required AAS courses: o AAS 100, AAS 200, AAS 301, AAS 400 (taken twice under different subtitles), and AAS 401 (capstone course and fulfills Graduate Composition & Communication Requirement [GCCR]).
- 15 hours of electives from an approved list. o 12 credits must be at the 300-level or above (many of these courses are cross-listed with AAS and other departments).
 o 6 or more credits of free electives (non-AAS prefix) at the 200-level or above in allied departments.

o Allied departments include A&S, AIS, A-H, HIS, SOC, ENG, MCLLC, MUS, ANT, GEO, PS, SW, EDP, and GWS. o Free electives may not be counted toward the UK Core or A&S requirements.
